a. 20 mph speed limit on Hurworth Road. – Cllr Tostevin stated that there was no update as yet.

- The Chairman congratulated Cllr Tostevin and Cllr Walters on their successful election campaign and election as Ward Councillors.
- Cllr Tostevin said that she had received a complaint about the position of the Welcome to Hurworth plaque near the Comet Inn. The residents claimed that this was actually Hurworth Place. It was pointed out by the Clerk that 8 years ago, the electorate was combined with 12 councillors representing Hurworth, and no specific seats for 'Hurworth Place or Blackwell Grange. This matter has been shelved, to see if any other residents express a view.
