

Crime Figures For October 01/10/2022- 31/10/2022

04/10/2022- Highway Disruption

Caller reporting that a vehicle has been driving through Neasham and it appears to have smoke coming from the back. Unsure if there is any damage to the vehicle, however the manor of driving is also poor. Officers attended and found the vehicle. Clutch problems with the car, car has been left and elderly passengers have been taken home by member of public.

07/10/2022- Public Order

Caller reporting that as they were driving along Tees View, another vehicle passenger has thrown a can of cider at the caller's car. The caller has had to swerve as they couldn't see out of their windscreen correctly. No damage has been caused to the caller's car; however, the incident has been crimed.

09/10/2022- Alarm False

Caller reporting an intruder alarm is going off at Blackwell Golf Club. Police attended, confirmed to be a false alarm by staff member.

11/10/2022- Record

Caller reporting that they have received a parking fine from Lewisham County Council, however the caller has not been to this area on the date listed on the parking fine. Vehicle details have been passed to call handlers and the relevant checks have been completed. Further checks to be done to make sure the vehicle has not been cloned.

16/10/2022- Road Related Offence

Caller reporting that they had been riding their horse along Neasham Road when a vehicle has driven past in an unsafe manner. The details of the vehicle have been passed to the call handler and the relevant checks have been conducted. Advice provided to the caller.

17/10/2022- RTC

Vehicle that has been involved in an RTC has been seen travelling along Croft Road. Officers attended and conducted an area search for the vehicle. Area search no trace.

18/10/2022- Suspicious/ Insecure

Caller reporting that a vehicle has been sat outside their address along Pilmore Mews and the person within the vehicle looked as though they were taking pictures of the caller's vehicle. The information has been added as Intel to Police sites for Police awareness.

19/10/2022- Highway Disruption

Caller reporting that there is quite a lot of mud on the road, on Croft Road. Caller is worried it may result in an RTC. Street Scene has been contacted in order to clean the road.

26/10/2022- Suspicious/ Insecure

Caller reporting a group of 4 males going door to door trying to get people to sign up to milk deliveries, along Hurworth Road. Caller is unsure whether the males are genuine or not, however no offences have been disclosed.

Caller is reporting a group of 4 males that have been smoking cannabis in the area around Hurworth Grange Community Association. Caller has tried to tell the males to move on, however the males have approached the caller and made threats. Caller has been given a diary appointment to find out more information and the local PCSO has been made aware of the incident.

28/10/2022- Highway Disruption

Caller is reporting that there is a white horse running on the A66 towards the Evans Halshaw garage. Persons are present and are trying to catch the horse. Officers attended when available and the horse was no longer present.

29/10/2022- RTC

Caller reporting that a male has lost control of his car on the bend along Croft Road, which has resulted in the vehicle landing in a ditch. Officers have attended and checked the driver. Driver has lost control due to the weather conditions and will arrange for his own recovery.

29/10/2022- ASB Nuisance

Caller reports loud music is coming from an address on Blackthorn Drive, however they are not sure what number. Officers attended, no noise coming from the street.

31/10/2022- Vehicle Crime

Caller is reporting that they have been walking in Geneva Woods, when they have returned to their vehicle, it has been damaged. The incident has been crimed as criminal damage and is currently under investigation.
