Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held at Hurworth Grange on Thursday, 4th April 2019

184. Chairman's Address

The Chair, Paul Walters, opened the meeting and welcomed the Councillors and members of the public.

The Chairman informed the meeting that there will not be an election for Hurworth Parish Council, as only 8 candidates had registered.

The next meeting of the Council will be held on Thursday, 16th May 2019, and this will incorporate three functions:-

- 1 **The Annual Meeting,** at which the Chairman and Vice Chairman will be appointed, by which time all the new Councillors will have signed their Acceptance of Office.
- 2. **The Annual Assembly,** which is a Public Meeting, convened by the Council for the residents.
- 3. The Parish Council's Monthly Meeting.

185. Public Participation

1. A resident enquired about the new planning application from Bellway, requesting permission to build a further five houses.

Richard Lawley responded explaining that the application was a change in the number, but also in the style of the houses. It appears that Bellway see a market for 3 bedroom houses, rather than all the larger styles. He will cover this further when he gives his report. There was also some concern about a new fence which has been constructed.

2. A resident enquired if there was any progress on the plans to enhance the children's playground at Hurworth Grange.

Bree Stamp responded, informing the meeting that there was now a lot of coverage on Facebook and the social media. She said that she is slightly disappointed at the response but is confident that they will attain the 200 supporters, which they are targeting to achieve a 'mass' sized group.

When this achieved, grants will be applied for, so the project is progressing well.

3. David Crisp, from the public gallery, asked if the Community team who have been working at Hurworth Grange could clean the Knell Gate passageway. Peter Foster agreed to investigate this, as it may be rubbish or tree branches from the two neighbours.

186. Minutes of the Meeting held on 7th March 2019 were accepted, Proposed by Dorothy Oughton, Seconded by Peter Foster.

187 Matters Arising

a. Hurworth Parish Entrance Plaques

Paul Walters reported that he has another meeting with Bellway to discuss the size of the signage and the placing of the Village Entrance Plaques

It is intended that planters with flowers will be placed beside the plaques and it is important that the placing is accurate.

It is expected that these will be in place within the next four weeks.

b. Barbara Bell asked that thanks be expressed to the Council for their award of £300 to the Friends of Rockliffe Court.

Barbara has arranged for students from Priory Hurworth House School who will be able to assist with the maintenance of the gardens at Rockliffe Court.

Richard said there was a large amount of information about the Bellway application on the DBC web site. Effectively, they wished to build five more 3 bedroom houses instead of the larger 5 bedroom houses.

189 Tree Report

Peter Foster reported that the care and maintenance which the Council has carried out in the last three years is proving its worth. He had inspected the trees around the village following the high winds, and all the trees were in good condition, with no broken branches.

A resident has reported a problem which appears to have been caused by the roots of four trees on Hurworth Grange land. The resident has applied for work to be done on these trees but DBC had rejected the application, as the trees are the subject of TPO's. The Council is now further investigating this matter.

193. Litter Picking

Dorothy Oughton reported that the Hurworth Primary School has held a 'Litter Pick Day'. This was well supported and the children enjoyed the event, and a great deal of litter was collected.

Bree Stamp reported that young people from the Priory Hurworth House School have also participated in a litter pick in the village. The young people had enjoyed the experience, and it is expected that more sessions will take place.

Dorothy Oughton stated that the dog fouling was much improved, although the area along the Glebe was still being used by dog owners who are not picking up.

194. Parish Walks

In the absence of Janine Forster there was no report.

Graham Wylie distributed copies of the completed Walks brochure, which is now complete. **The Clerk was asked to print copies and distribute them.** The meeting thanked Graham for his good work on this project.

195. Web site and Guestbook

Graham Wylie said that there has been very little activity on the web site, and only one message in the Guestbook.

The licence for the Guestbook software, £39, is due in May. The meeting discussed whether to continue with the facility. Finally it was agreed that Bree Stamp and Graham would seek alternative free software applications, which may be more suitable.

Association reports

Peter Foster reported that there is to be a meeting at Hurworth Village Hall on 8th April, when the Mayor of Cleveland will be detailing the plans for Durham Teesside Airport, now that it is in private hands.

Tony Winnett said that he had attended the Durham Tees Valley Airport Consultative Committee Meeting 3 April 2019.

Stobart Group will be the operator and are in process of taking over Finance
